SUBJECT: Transportation and Infrastructure Committee Hearing on EPA Regulations

The full title of the hearing was: "Integrated Planning and Permitting, Part 2. An opportunity for EPA to provide communities with flexibility to make smart investments in water quality."

The hearing in the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee yesterday goes to the very heart of the challenge of how our nation can prioritize and pay for regulation related infrastructure.
