





     Large-scale wildland fires more frequent & larger





May 18, 1996 Burned 11 miles in 4 hrs. 11,900 acres Disaster totaled \$35M

July 12, 1996 Rained 2.5" in 2 hrs. Severe erosion, Major flooding, Silted Strontia Springs Res. 7% of capacity

## Hayman Fire & Flooding






June 8 - 18, 2002 Burned 138,114 acres Totaled \$39M for firefighting Burned over 600 structures Totaled \$40M property value

#### Flooding in the foothills

With virtually no vegetation to hold back the runoff on the land burned in the Hayman fire, heavy rains since Friday have caused property and road destruction from Westcreek to Deckers.
