Lake Mead


- Water level at historic low

Duarte Nursery v. Army Corps of Engineers, 2:13-cv-02095 (E.D. Cal. 2016)

- Background
- July 10, 2016 order granted summary judgment to United States
- Appealed to 9th Circuit
- Implications





Coyote Lake Ranch v. City of Lubbock, No. 14-0572, 2016 WL 3176683 (Tex. May 27, 2016)

- Opinion released on May 27, 2016
- Texas Supreme Court: Accommodation doctrine applies to severed groundwater estate
- Expands the decades old doctrine



US Army Corps v. Hawkes Co. Inc., Case No. 15-290 (May 31, 2016).

- Approved wetlandsdesignation is a "final agency action" under the Administrative Procedure Act
- May be challenged in court without landowner first obtaining a § 404 permit under the Clean Water Act





EPA Regulatory Decision

- EPA issued a decision on forest road discharges
 - Declined to regulate forest road discharges under Clean Water Act § 402.
 - Deferring to state and local programs with consultation



EPA Final Rule: Oil and Gas Effluent

- EPA issued final rule prohibiting unconventional oil and gas well operators from discharging wastewater to publiclyowned treatment works
 - Effective August 29, 2016
 - Implementation deadline August 29, 2019





EPA Selenium Regulations

- On July 1, 2016, EPA proposed a Clean Water Act Rule to tighten selenium water quality criteria for the waters of San Francisco Bay and Delta
- Proposes criteria of:
 - 8.5 micro-gram per gram fish dry weight
 - 11.3 micro-gram per gram fish muscle
 - 15 micro-gram per gram clam tissue
 - 0.2 micro-gram per liter dissolved water
 - 1 micro-gram per liter particulate water



EPA Selenium Regulations

- On July 30, 2016, EPA published a final updated national chronic aquatic life criterion
- This criterion is the EPA's fist tissue based aquatic life criterion
- EPA recommends the following criteria:
 - 15.1 mg per kg for egg/ovary
 - 8.5 mg/kg for whole body
 - 1.5 micro-grams/liter of lentic waters
 - 3.1 micro-grams/liter of lotic waters

Comparison of 2016 Selenium Criterion to 1999 Criteria.

Tribal Water Quality Standards Rule

- September 26 EPA published notice of a final rule "Treatment of Indian Tribes in a Similar Manner as States for Purposes of Section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act"
- By allowing tribes to obtain treatment as states "TAS" status, tribes may issues lists of impaired waters and develop Total Maximum Daily Loads.
- Effective October 26, 2016 (yesterday)

Texas v. New Mexico and Colorado, U.S. Sup. Ct. No. 220141

- Case pending before the Supreme Court
- Background
- June 28 First Report of the Special Master






Mississippi v. Tennessee, U.S. Sup Ct. No. 220143

- Mississippi brought suit alleging Memphis, Tennessee is pumping too much water from the Sparta-Memphis and altering flow of water
- Mississippi brought suit claiming it has absolute ownership of water of aquifer in its sovereign territory
- Ruled against at district court and appellate level, appealed to US Supreme Court

- In Re: Dep't of Defense and EPA Clean Water Rule, Case No. 15-3751 et al.
- September 2, 2016 Writ of certiorari filed with US Supreme Court challenging 6th Circuits
